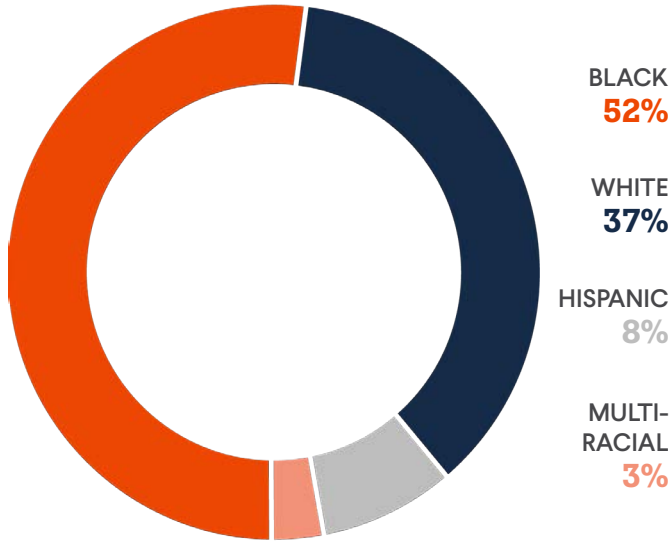

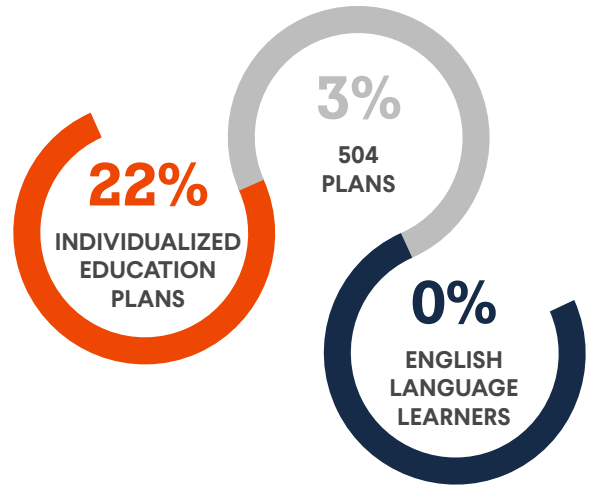

STUDENT DEMOGRAPHICS



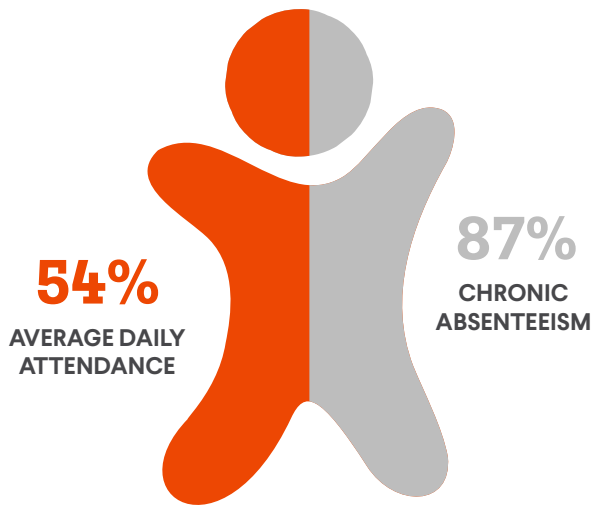

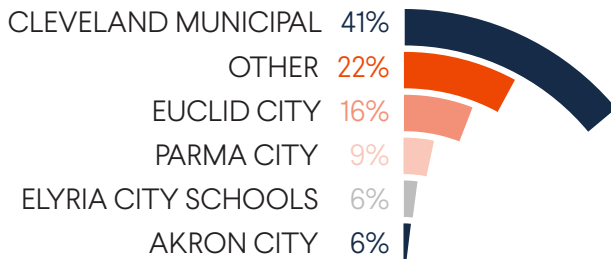

ACADEMIC PROGRESS

The academic goals of George Voinovich High School during the 2021-2022 school year were to:

- Increase school attendance average by 6%
- Raise Math and Reading results from STAR testing out of the low-low average category by 3%
- Offer students opportunities to earn more than the typical 5 credits offered each year; students will be able to make up an additional 2 to 4 credits per year

Emerging from the pandemic, GVHS met these goals as evidenced by Ohio Department of Education ratings and by rebranding and programming the school to launch in 2022-23 as George Voinovich Contemporary Career High School. Additionally, the Class of 2022 included twelve seniors: 42% graduated, with two students planning to enroll in the Military, one matriculating to a four-year college, and one student matriculating to a two-year college.
